2021 Noah and Evelyn Arell Scholarship Program

Thank you for your interest in the Arell Scholarship Program administered by the Rotary Club of Concord.

In September 2006, Mrs. Evelyn Arell passed away at the age of 96. She, a professional hairdresser, and her husband Noah, an accountant who had predeceased her, did not have children. On her passing, a \$5 million trust fund that had been established through the couple's careful savings and business acumen was left to 24 local charities and organizations. The Rotary Club of Concord received a portion of these funds.

Over many years, The Rotary Club of Concord has raised funds for scholarships and the Arell funds were added to the Rotary club's charitable trust foundation. Today, the Rotary Club of Concord manages a diverse and benevolent scholarship program to serve a wide array of students.

The Arell Scholarship Program supports displaced and adult learners and traditional college students attending many forms of post-secondary education including licensure and certificate programs and two-year and four-year college degree programs. It does not support graduate school beyond a bachelor's degree

College Scholarship -- General Information

We are pleased you are interested in the Arell College Scholarship Program.. This page covers the basic information you need to know before applying.

This specific scholarship program is for individuals pursuing a 2 or 4 year college degree.

Note: Applicants pursuing a Workforce based credential should use the other Arell Workforce Scholarship application.

Basics of applying:

- The scholarship application is available at www.concordnhrotary.com.
- Residency requirement -- the applicant must meet one of the following criteria:
 - Be enrolled (soon to graduate) or have graduated from a high school in Concord. This includes for example: Concord High School, Merrimack Valley High School, Bishop Brady High School, Concord Christian Academy, Parker Academy, Trinity Christian School, St. Paul's School.
 - Have a verifiable residence in Concord or Penacook.
 - Have fully completed a two-year CTE program at the Concord Regional Technical Center.
- Application details:
 - All application materials must be submitted in one envelope with no stapled or double-sided pages.
 - All questions should be answered in the approximate space allotted.
 - No supplementary pages or materials will be accepted.
- Application Deadline is **May 22,2021**
- A completed application package includes:
 - A transcript either from high school or from a college if the applicant has completed at least six on-campus classes.
 - A letter of recommendation from a teacher, professor, counselor or employer.
 - A copy of your Student Aid Report including your EFC amount derived from your FAFSA.
